Dear Families,

Last week at school we celebrated National Reconciliation Week. This year's theme is **"In This Together"**.

"National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia."

The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey—the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively". (www.reconciliation.org.au).



MiniLit


Literacy intervention

MiniLit Intervention continues at Augusta Park Primary School in 2020 for some of our Junior Primary students.

Mrs Carn, Mrs Press and Kylie run MiniLit each afternoon. MiniLit is 80 lessons and occurs 4-5 times per week, 50 minutes per lesson. Students work on three main components:

- Sounds and Word activities
- Text reading
- Story Book reading

This week we celebrate one of Kylie's groups. This group has completed all 80 lessons and now graduates from the program!! This is a fantastic achievement for our students. They are well on their way to becoming confident, independent readers and learners.
