Dear Families,

Monday is Harmony Day which celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. It's about inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for everyone. We encourage all students to wear orange on Monday to acknowledge this important day. During the week classes will be doing activities to celebrate Harmony day.



As we are just over halfway through the term I would also like to remind families that students are not permitted to be on school grounds before 8:35am as this is the start of the school day. The only students allowed to be onsite prior to this time are those who have caught the bus.

NO HAT NO PLAY

As part of our sun safe policy students must wear a bucket or broad brimmed hat at all times when they are outside at school. Please be advised that a baseball cap does not protect cheeks, ears and the back of the neck therefore cannot be worn at school in accordance with advice from the Cancer Council. If children don't have a hat they are unable to play outside and will be required to play either in the library or sit quietly in the canteen area. We have hats available at the front office for \$7.70 if families need to purchase a new one.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We would like to take this opportunity to remind families that we have a compulsory school uniform which comprises:

- Navy T-shirt with pale blue inserts adorned with the school logo.
- School hoodie with school logo or a baseball jacket style.
- Summer school dress of blue and white check.
- School hat (bucket)

It is expected that all students wear their school uniform every day. If students are not in school uniform, in accordance with our policy students will be given a loan shirt. If the loan shirt is not returned within 5 days families will be invoiced for the cost of the shirt.

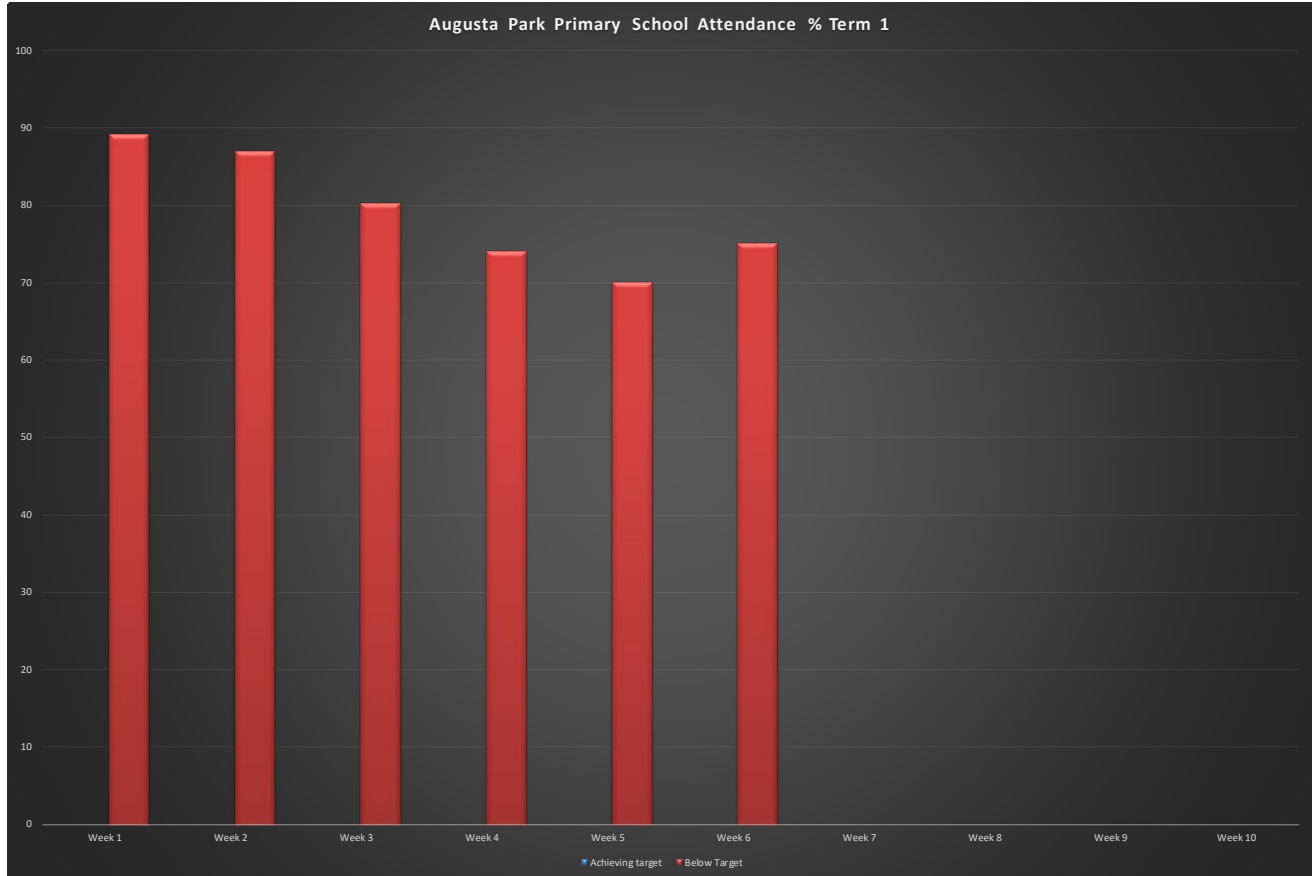
Payment is able to be made via instalments or in full. If you are having difficulties organising a uniform for your child please see us so that we can support you to do this.

MATHS

In Maths this term we have been learning all about counting, subitising, and numbers! Subitising is when you see a group of objects and immediately know how many there are without counting each object individually. We have been practising subitising through Maths warm ups on the Smartboard, partner/group games and learning tasks using dice, ten frames, and numbers. We have been practising recognising and writing numbers 0-10 and ordering them.
